# Careers with Languages



## Language graduates and the employment market

Language students have excellent communication skills and broad cultural awareness, usually backed up with the experience gained on a year abroad. Graduates with a good command of modern languages are sought after for numerous roles in a variety of organisations and sectors. Language skills are particularly useful when combined with expertise in other fields and often provide that extra edge that makes a graduate stand out.

Skills acquired with a degree in Languages include:

- Excellent oral communication skills
- The ability to manage time effectively, work alone but also as part of a team
- Provide excellent customer service
- Have excellent written communication skills, both in English and other chosen language
- An understanding of managing one's own learning
- The ability to perform multiple tasks and to problem-solve
- Sensitivity to different cultures and can deal with new situations
- IT, information retrieval and presentation skills
- Analytic ability and numeracy skills

All these careers require excellent communication skills, the skills of research, analysis and writing, for which a degree with languages is excellent preparation.

Work experience is also a key issue and any experience you have to add to your CV will be a bonus. Volunteering is also an excellent way of adding experience to your CV.
