Classics graduates and the employment market

Classics students acquire a wide range of skills and qualities that are valuable in many professions.

With three main strands to studying Classics at NUI Galway - languages, the history of ideas, and visual art- students gain a sophisticated ability to understand another culture and the past. Other skills acquired include:

- Appreciation of the historical, social, cultural and political context of classical civilisation
- The ability to understand a range of viewpoints and critical approaches
- Ability to use and combine diverse sources of evidence
- Ability to use methodologies to collect, quantify, analyse and interpret data
- Engage in analytical, evaluative and lateral thinking
- Command techniques, such as research skills, use of statistics, philosophical argument and judgement
- Produce logical arguments supported by evidence
- Communication skills – oral and written
- IT, information retrieval and presentation skills
- Skills in translation and the ability to apply modern foreign language skills
