## KEYNOTE SPEAKERS:

**Prof. Stephen Heppell** was formerly Director of the Ultralab e-learning research centre and is a highly regarded and distinguished expert on technologies for learning, across all age spans. He contributes to the Guardian, BBC and Channel 4 and past projects include notschool.net, the Ultraversity, and the design of "world classrooms." He has served as advisor and consultant to various government departments in the UK on eLearning, classroom design and the internet.

**Prof. Ray Land** is Professor of Higher Education and Director of the Centre for Academic Practice & Learning Enhancement at the University of Strathclyde. He is a member and founding accreditator of the Higher Education Academy and his research interests include theory and practice of educational development, threshold concepts and troublesome knowledge and theoretical aspects of digital learning.

**Prof. Michael Kerres** holds a chair in Educational Media & Knowledge Management and is also the Vice-Rector for Information, Communication & Media at the University of Duisburg-Essen.

**Prof. Wim van Petegem** is the Director of AVNet (the learning technology service) at the Katholieke Universiteit, Leuven, one of Europe's oldest institutions of higher education. He has extensive experience of elearning policy and practice and has led a number of European projects and served on international panels and committees in the field of elearning.

## TOPICS:

- (1) **E-learning in Practice** – a discussion forum for staff with experience of delivering e-learning supported programmes, providing an opportunity for sharing ideas and knowledge.
- (2) **Web 2.0** – combination of short practical sessions and discussions around the educational potential of blogs, wikis, portfolios, podcasts and social networking tools.
- (3) **"Share and Share Alike"** – learning objects, digital repositories, creative commons – exploring issues in sharing teaching and learning materials across institutions.
- (4) **Assistive Technologies** – policy and practice in the use of a range of assistive technologies for learners with specific needs and examining issues of inclusion.
- (5) **"You Tube, I Tube, We Tube"** – audio and video materials in higher education: production, distribution and pedagogy – with applications across a range of subjects from medicine to languages.

Our programme will endeavour to provide ample opportunity to thoroughly debate key issues in theory and practice and to make the event as participative as possible. We are keen for practitioners from higher education to both showcase their own work and interact with colleagues from across the sector. A continual poster session will run throughout the event and a parallel strand of short presentations will also be scheduled.
