Course Overview

A new cycle of the NUI Galway Diploma Series will commence in September 2018. Modern language Diplomas in French, Italian, German and Spanish are available to those interested in developing their language skills. Additional Diploma courses are available in a wide variety of subjects ranging from Archaeology to Marketing. We are also delighted to add a new Diploma in Earth and Ocean Sciences which will be delivered via blended learning.

So, whether you want to improve your career prospects or take a course for your own personal development and enjoyment, we have a course to suit you.

How the Diplomas Are Structured

The Diploma programmes are delivered part-time over two years. Course delivery ranges from weekly evening lectures to fully online learning. The academic year is divided into two semesters, one beginning in early September and the other in early January. In the majority of programmes each semester consists of twelve teaching weeks, a study week and an examination period. Students are required to participate in classes (online and face-to-face)

on a regular basis. Additional time is required for home study such as reading, research, completing assessments and preparation for exams.

Course Entry Requirements

There are no formal entry requirements for any of the Diploma programmes. Students who are aged 21 or over by January 1st of the year of admission are classified as mature students and gain entry on this basis.

Proficiency in the use of computers and the internet is beneficial, and in the case of online courses in particular, recommended.

Students under the age of 21 applying to complete a part-time course at NUI Galway will be asked to fulfil the matriculation requirements of the University. If you are under 21, please log onto www.nuigalway.ie/adult-learning/faqs/ where you will find a list of the matriculation entry requirements.

English Language Requirement

If your first language is not English, or you have not been educated through the medium of the English language, you are required to

present an English language qualification (IELTS/TOEFL). The English language requirement does not apply to the language diplomas.

Fee Scholarships

Scholarships are available for applicants who are in receipt of a social welfare payment and wish to update their skills and knowledge by participating in one of the listed courses. What Happens After I Apply?

Once you apply online, your application is assessed in accordance with the course selection criteria. Places will be offered as soon as the minimum class number has been reached.

To accept your place, you are required to:

1. Accept your course place using the online applications portal
2. Pay a deposit of €485 (€1,470 Non-EU) within the specified timeframe – this deposit is offset against the full fee payment

Diploma in ARCHAEOLOGY (Classroom Based)

Who is this course for?

The diploma course is open to anyone with an interest in the past. It may be of particular interest to first and second level teachers and others interested in the contribution of archaeology to education, local studies, heritage studies and tourism.

Course Profile

Aim

Archaeology is the study of the material remains of past human societies. The discipline covers a remarkable span of time and investigates some of the most profoundly important developments of the past. The wide scope of archaeology, in time, space and methodology is one of the features that makes the subject so attractive to professional and amateur alike. There is something to interest everyone - whether their interests lie in outdoor fieldwork and exploring ancient monuments, the study of artefacts, the history of technology, local studies, or simply in the rich heritage of Ireland's past.

This course aims to equip participants with a sound knowledge of Ireland's archaeological heritage from the earliest settlers to the medieval period.

Content

The course consists of lectures, fieldwork and project work. The course offers a general introduction to the discipline of archaeology and material culture of some nine millennia of the Irish past. Participants are also introduced to the discipline of archaeology, its historical development worldwide, theoretical perspectives and methodologies. They will examine the archaeology of Ireland in general, and explore the prehistoric and historic archaeology of human settlement in their region.

Diploma in ARCHAEOLOGY ONLINE

Who is this course for?

This diploma is the ideal course of study for anyone with an interest in the Irish past, whether amateur or professional. The latter might include primary school teachers, secondary school teachers, heritage employees, those employed in the tourism industry, and local government employees.

Course Profile

Aim

Archaeology is a constantly changing discipline, fed by new discoveries, new theoretical approaches and new analytical methods. These discoveries continue to revolutionise the subject's potential to inform us about the past and to give us a valuable long perspective on how this past has shaped our present. Exciting aspects of the practical side of archaeology, such as excavation, are familiar to everyone, but excavation is only one aspect of a discipline that combines humanistic interest with scientific method. For the interested student, archaeology offers a stimulating opportunity for intellectual enquiry.

This two year course has four broad aims:

- To introduce students to the discipline of archaeology.

- To present the archaeology of Ireland as a way of understanding ten thousand years of human settlement on this island.
- To study aspects of current archaeological research in Ireland in detail.
- To promote interest in Ireland's heritage at a national and international level.

Diploma in EARTH & OCEAN SCIENCES

Who is this course for?

This course will appeal to those with an interest in our natural environment and the outdoors. It may be professionally beneficial for geography teachers, environmental scientists, engineers, archaeologists.

Course Profile

Aim

The aim of the Diploma in Scientific Studies (Earth & Ocean Sciences) is to provide students with a broad introduction to the study of the Earth's solid geology and its coastal ocean, with hands-on, practical experience of the techniques employed within the fields of geology, oceanography, and Earth observation.

Content

The course will use online lectures and practical exercises, as well as monthly weekend workshops and field trips, to study the Earth's origins, materials and processes at all scales from the atomic to the planetary level; internal and external; and locally, nationally, and internationally.

One module will deal with our coastal ocean, examining the interaction of geology, ground- and surface water, and the marine environment. Another will focus on Earth observation and remote sensing, and how these are used to help understand the physical, chemical, and biological processes acting on the Earth's surface. A common theme throughout will be the interaction of people with the planet we inhabit. Fieldtrips (within Ireland) are an integral part of the course.

Diploma in FRENCH

Who is this course for?

This course is open to anyone with an interest in French and who wishes to gain fluency in the language. The Diploma caters for all levels of language ability. The course is offered at three levels: beginner, intermediate and advanced.

Direct Entry to Second Year

Application to enter year 2 of the Diploma in French is available to those who have completed an equivalent course at third level or who have lived in a Francophone country for an extended period. Applications are assessed on a case-by-case basis, through Recognition of Prior Learning.

Course Profile

Aim

This course aims to enable students with an interest in French to acquire a high level of written and oral communication skills in the language through a variety of practical language exercises. Students will also study major cultural issues in the contemporary French-speaking world. In their second year, students will be introduced to

the world of French literature. As the course progresses, students should be able to converse on and comprehend a variety of topics and situations.

Diploma in GERMAN

Who is this course for?

The Diploma in German introduces students to the basic elements of German and is designed for those who have no previous knowledge of the language.

Direct Entry to Second Year

If you already have prior knowledge of the language, or a Leaving Certificate in the subject, you can apply for direct entry to the second year. Your level will be assessed by a written examination that will take place in August.

Course Profile

Aim

Whether your interest in German has a business focus or you want to get to know interesting and exciting regions such as the Austrian Alps, the Diploma in German can get you started. This two-year course will help you develop the skills to communicate successfully in the German-speaking world while exciting your curiosity about other cultures.

Content

Students will begin with the basic elements of German grammar and vocabulary and will progress to the study of a selection of social and cultural issues in the contemporary

German-speaking world. By the end of each term, students will have learned to converse on and comprehend a variety of topics in situations that are normally encountered in a modern German-speaking environment.

Knowledge of German is more useful than ever for career opportunities involving international trade, customer service within multinational companies, as well as the tourism industry.

Diploma in IRISH STUDIES (Online)

Who is this course for?

This course is of appeal to those who are interested in Ireland's past and culture including primary school teachers, secondary school teachers and heritage employees. It will also be of appeal to those who are employed in the tourism industry.

Course Profile

Aim

The Diploma in Irish Studies is an interdisciplinary introduction to the discipline of Irish Studies and offers an excellent opportunity for those interested in Ireland, especially those without access to traditional programmes of study in this area.

The purpose of the diploma is to provide a basic introduction to Irish life and culture through the disciplines of archaeology, history, literature in English and in Irish (presented in translation), political science and sociology, and traditional Irish music and dance.

Content

The course provides an overview of Irish history from the pagan Celtic world and the coming of Christianity through to the cataclysmic famines of the 1840s, the establishment of an independent state in 1922 and Ireland's integration into the

European community. Students are introduced to Irish literature in both the Irish (Gaelic) and English languages, from the Old-Irish sagas and early Irish lyrics through the emergence of Anglo-Irish literature in the 18th century to the 20th century revival of writing in Irish.

Aim

This course is designed to give participants enhanced language skills for personal, travel and professional purposes.

Students will be introduced to the basics of the Italian language in order to develop competence in handling common situations of everyday life. The course concentrates on all of the four main language skills (listening, speaking, reading and writing) and uses carefully selected authentic material to provide a gradual introduction to the structures and functions of the language. Diploma in ITALIAN (Online)

Who is this course for?

The Diploma in Italian Online can be taken at intermediate level in 2018.

The online course is particularly suitable for students who need flexibility in their time and mode of study and/or live away from Galway. Basic computer skills are sufficient for the online students, including an ability to download and upload files, navigate websites, and use emails and Skype-style applications. An introductory on-campus session at the beginning of the course will explain in very simple terms how to use these applications and will take students through all the steps necessary to become familiar with these learning tools.

Course Profile

Aim

This course is designed to give participants enhanced language skills for personal, travel and professional purposes. This course is based on a collaborative, communicative approach and

students are encouraged to participate in virtual class activities with their peers and e-tutors.

Content

Students will be guided through each interactive and participative online module, which will emphasize collaborative learning in order to avoid any feelings of isolation. Lecture packages will be delivered weekly online and will include comprehension tasks, individual and group work, and conversation and intercultural aspects. Three on-campus sessions per semester are also included (held on Saturdays).

This course caters for students who have already obtained a Level A2 of fluency in Italian and focuses on the four main language skills (listening, speaking, reading and writing) using regular practice based, as much as possible, on authentic material carefully selected to guide students towards the acquisition of more advanced structures and functions of the language.

A cultural module will present aspects of Italian culture and society from both a linguistic and an intercultural perspective, introducing texts and personalities from Italian arts, music, cinema, literature and exploring societal issues

Diploma in PSYCHOLOGY OF COUNSELLING

Who is this course for?

The Diploma is designed for individuals who are involved in a helping or advice-giving role. In particular, it caters for members of self-help groups, volunteers in befriending and support organizations, individuals engaged in personnel work and staff of educational, youth and health services.

Course Profile

Aim

The course aims to provide a basic grounding in the psychology of lifespan development and major psychological theories of personality and their application to counselling. The practical aspects of the course include basic counselling skills and group facilitation of personal development. The course enables participants to gain a better

understanding of the processes in which they are involved and to develop their counselling skills. The Diploma is also suitable for people who would like, subsequently, to pursue a professional counselling course, as it provides a foundation in the theory and basic skills of counselling.

Who is this course for?

The Diploma in Marketing is aimed at students who seek a marketing qualification to develop their careers. Students will be equipped with key concepts and skills, vital to embark on a career in marketing.

Course Profile

Aim

The modules in this diploma provide a solid foundation in the principles and practice of marketing.

This diploma is ideal for students who wish to:

- Understand the principles of marketing
- Become knowledgeable of key marketing concepts
- Understand marketing's role in business
- Develop essential skills in marketing, research, services and negotiation
- Apply this knowledge to a wide range of industry settings

Content

The first year of this course provides the theoretical foundations of marketing principles. Through a combination of game-based learning and online technology, you will gain a deeper understanding of

The Diploma in Spanish is designed for those who have little or no previous knowledge of the language and wish to gain Spanish language skills for personal or professional reasons.

Direct Entry to Second Year

If you already have prior knowledge of the language, or a Leaving Certificate in the subject, you can apply for direct entry to the second year. Your level will be assessed by a written examination that will take place in August.



Course Profile

Aim

The Diploma in Spanish will help students to develop communication skills in Spanish that will facilitate travel or work. On completion of the course, students will have the necessary oral, comprehension and writing skills to deal with a range of situations encountered in everyday life in Spain and Latin America.

Content

The course will include elements of Spanish grammar and vocabulary and an introduction to social and cultural issues in the contemporary Spanish-speaking world. By the end of each year, students will be able to discuss a variety of topics relevant to life in Spain or Latin America today. Student participation and active learning will be key features in course delivery.
