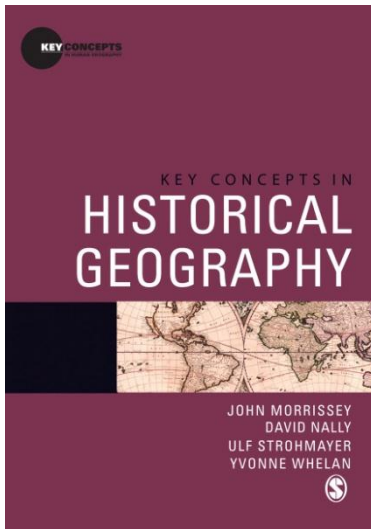
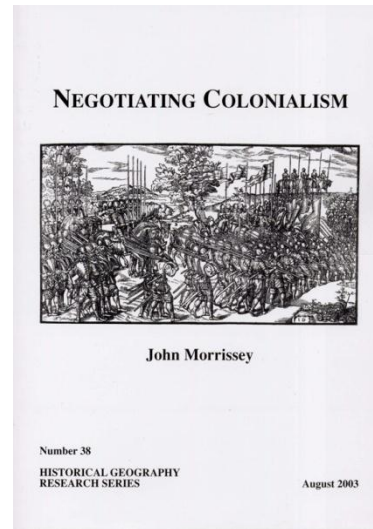

11 Research group involvement, journal refereeing and conference networking

Throughout the time since finishing my PhD, my research and scholarly standing has continued to develop through a proactive involvement in research committees in my field, editing and refereeing of leading international journals (e.g. *Antipode*, *Political Geography*) and fruitful liaising with colleagues at Geography's leading national and international conferences.

In that time, I launched the HGRG website, established an e-mail listserv, tri-annually edited a new research group newsletter and supported various HGRG conferences and workshops.
- ♦ I have been centrally involved in the *Irish Postgraduate Training Consortium* (IPTC) since 2001. The IPTC is an annual 3-day conference attended by postgraduates and staff from every Geography department in Ireland, north and south. It is specially designed to support and network postgraduates by providing hands-on instruction on the theory and practice of doing research.
