

The Michael Mac Namara Scholarship

RDJ Glynn Solicitors have agreed to fund the establishment of a scholarship which will be awarded on the basis of a competition open to all applicants for the LL.M. in Law, Technology and Governance in NUI Galway. It is tenable for a period of one year of full-time study and will be paid monthly subject to adequate progress.

Eligibility

To be eligible to enter for the RDJ Glynn scholarship, candidates must first apply for the LL.M. in Law, Technology and Governance. Only candidates who are offered a place on this programme will be considered for the scholarship.

Conditions for the Award

The award of the RDJ Glynn scholarship will be based on academic merit, judged on the following:

- a *curriculum vitae* and certified *academic transcript*;
- the reports of *two academic referees*;
- a *statement of study objectives*, maximum 300 words, outlining how successful completion of the LL.M. would advance the candidate's academic and career goals; and
- a *personal statement*, maximum 300 words, outlining the candidate's personal and academic development to date.

Selection Process

A panel consisting of the programme director of the LL.M. in Law, Technology and Governance (or representative), the Professor of Business Law, the Head of the School of Law (or representative), and the Dean of the College of Business, Public Policy and Law (or representative) will select the successful candidate. The decision of the panel will be subject to approval by the Board of the School of Law.

Lodgement of Documents

Four copies of the required documentation must be submitted to the Programme Director, LL.M. in Law, Technology and Governance, Law School, National University of Ireland, Galway, by **8 July 2011**.
