



The Pauline & Bunnie Jones Scholarship

The Scholarship

The Pauline & Bunnie Jones Scholarship was established to support students from schools in County Roscommon, wishing to register for a full-time undergraduate programme at NUI Galway.

Value

The Scholarship is a multi-year award of €2,500 per annum for the first 4 years of study in any full-time undergraduate programme in the university. The award will not be issued for repeat years.

Eligibility

In order to be deemed eligible for the award, students must:

- Have applied for any full-time undergraduate programme at NUI Galway, via the Central Applications Office (CAO), for the academic year in which the scholarship is awarded;
- Be registered as a student of NUI Galway by the due registration date, complete the registration requirements and remain registered until at least 1st March of the academic year in which the scholarship is awarded;
- Have attended and sat the Leaving Certificate Examination of the Department of Education and Skills at any school in County Roscommon.
- Register their interest in the award by completing the online scholarship application on or before 1st August preceding the start of the academic year in which the scholarship is awarded.

Basis of Award

Four scholarships will be awarded based on the results of the Leaving Certificate Examination of the Department of Education and Skills taken in any one year, to students who meet the eligibility criteria set out above, as follows:

- To the two students with the highest Leaving Certificate score, which was sat whilst attending Scoil Mhuire, Clochar na Trócaire, Strokestown, Roscommon
- To the two students with the highest Leaving Certificate score, which was taken whilst attending any other school in County Roscommon

The award will be limited to a maximum of one medical student only, who shall have the highest Leaving Certificate score which was sat whilst attending any school in County Roscommon.

The scholarship will be award in accordance with the following scheme:

- Not more and not less than six of those subjects accepted by the National University of Ireland for Matriculation registration will be considered.
- Scores will be determined by applying values as follows: H1=100, H2=88, H3=77, H4=66, H5=56, H6=46, H7=37, H8=0 to results obtained on higher level papers respectively; and scores of O1=56, O2=46, O3=37, O4=28, O5=20, O6=12, O7=0, O8=0 to results obtained

on ordinary level papers.

- No bonus points will be added for any subjects.

Tenure

The scholarship is tenable only at the National University of Ireland, Galway for four years of any full-time primary degree course offered by the University, and only in the session for which it is awarded. It may not be deferred.

The award may not be used in conjunction with any other NUI Galway Scholarship.

Condition of Award

The individual in receipt of the scholarship must be attending the programme on a full-time basis.

If the holder withdraws from the programme for which she/he has registered or fails to continue throughout the session to meet the attendance and other requirements of the programme, they will forfeit the scholarship and will be required to repay to the University the whole or any part of the scholarship as may be decided.

Procedures for Selection of Scholarship Students

The scholarship will be administered by the Admissions Office, NUI Galway.

The Admissions Office will review students for eligibility and will verify examination scores after the Leaving Certificate Re-checks.

Nature of Award

The award will take the form of a cheque issued to the value of €2,500 in each of the four academic years.
