



# **Short Report**

CHO1 Area: Trends in Health Behaviours, Health Outcomes and Contextual Factors between 1998-2018

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#### Introduction

The Health Behaviour in School-aged Children (HBSC) study is a cross-national research study conducted in collaboration with the World Health Organisation (WHO) Regional Office for Europe and runs on a four-year cycle. In 2018, Ireland participated for the sixth time in the HBSC study (<u>www.nuigalway.ie/hbsc</u>). The overall aims of the HBSC study are to gain new insight into, and increase our understanding of young people's health and well-being, health behaviours and their social context. HBSC collects data on key indicators of health, health attitudes, and health behaviours, as well as the context of health for young people. The study is a school-based survey with information collected from students through self-completion questionnaires in classrooms. HBSC Ireland 2018 was funded by the Department of Health. The most recent data collection took place in 2018 and was the sixth survey cycle of the study in Ireland. Previous surveys were undertaken in 1998, 2002, 2006, 2010, and 2014. To date, HBSC Ireland has collected data from 62,720 school-aged children aged 10-17 years across the Republic of Ireland. # Focus of this report

This short report focuses on the self-reported health status of children in the CHO1 Area over time in relation to key indicators: health behaviours, health outcomes, and the social contexts of their lives. Figures are provided from the national trends report for comparative purposes.
