Presidents' Messages



On this, the second occasion in which the Degree of Master of Fine Arts is being conferred in the Burren College of Art, I congratulate today's three graduating students who have come to the Burren to take this Degree programme, not unlike those who came to the Law School in the Burren in olden times.

Today is also a historic occasion in its being the first conferral of the Degree of Doctor of Fine Arts, *honoris causa*, on-site in a Third-Level Institution in Co. Clare, and I congratulate John Baldessari who will receive this honour today.

NUI Galway is proud of the linkage established between it and the Burren College of Art, following an approach from the College to the University in September 2000 with a view to an academic linkage between us in the Fine Arts area. The University was happy to take up that invitation, not just because of the College's high standing internationally, but also because of its commitment to enhancing the higher-education infrastructure in Co. Clare, as demonstrated by the decision at that time to offer a BA programme in Ennis, at the request of the Co. Clare authorities and agencies.

Particular congratulations are due to Mary Hawkes-Greene, the President of the College, and the staff here on their achievements to date. Our thanks also go to the Centre for Irish Studies in NUI Galway on their contribution to the MFA programme. I wish the Burren College of Art every success in the years ahead.



"What a place for an art college..... what possibilities". Prophetic words which incarnate in the works of the students who graduate today..... and how appropriate that John Baldessari, the man who uttered these words over a decade ago at the opening of the Burren College of Art, should be acknowledged by the National

Iarrtar ar an haíonna gluaiseacht, ón tosach anuas, leis an Mórshiúl Acadúil, ar fhágáil dó.

Beidh Fáiltiú san Áiléir ina dhiaidh sin.

THE HONORARY DEGREE CONFERRAL CEREMONY

Dr. Iognáid Ó Muircheartaigh, President of National University of Ireland, Galway, and also Pro-Vice-Chancellor of the National University of Ireland, welcomes the guests.

After the Secretary for Academic Affairs, NUI Galway (Dr. Séamus Mac Mathúna) has declared (in Latin) the Meeting open, the Honorary Graduand, John Baldessari, will be introduced by Professor Timothy Emlyn Jones.

Following the Introductory Address, he presents the Honorary Graduand to the Pro-Vice-Chancellor in the following words (in Latin):

*Right Honourable Pro-Vice- Chancellor and all the University!
I present to you this my son whom I know to be,
in respect both of character and of learning,
a fit and proper person for admission to the Degree of Doctor of Fine Arts, honoris causa,
and I pledge to thee and to all the Academy my solemn word that so it is.*

The Pro-Vice-Chancellor confers the Degree, saying (in Latin):

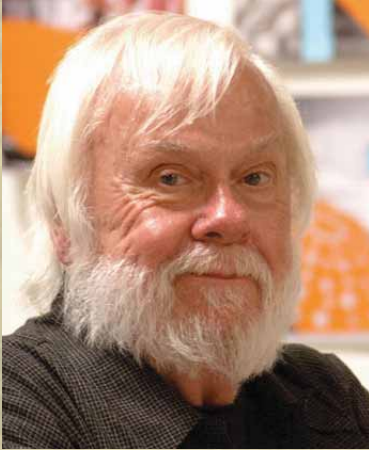
*I, for my part, with the authority granted me, admit thee to
the Degree of Doctor of Fine Arts, honoris causa.*

Nóta Eolais ar an Réamhchéimí Oinigh *A Note about the Honorary Graduand*



John Baldessari - Artist

John Baldessari is one of the best known conceptual artists in the world and has been credited as having invented a new form of photography. He has been a member of the Advisory Council of Burren College of Art since it opened in 1994 and has visited the college on four occasions since then. His contribution has been invaluable to the establishment of the international significance of Burren College of Art and we look forward to extending his influence into the joint NUI Galway-Burren College of Art MFA programme. This is an apposite time to formally recognise his outstanding contribution to art and art education by means of an honorary doctorate.

John Baldessari was born in National City in 1931. He attended San Diego State University and did post-graduate work at Otis Art Institute and Chouinard Art Institute and U.C. Berkeley. He taught at the California Institute of the Arts in Valencia until 1990 and is currently teaching at UCLA. He has been a major influence on several generations of artists. His art has been featured in more than 120 solo exhibitions in the U.S. and Europe and in over 300 group exhibitions. His projects include artist books, videos, films, billboards and public works. His awards include the Governor's Award for Lifetime Achievement in the Visual Arts in California, the Oscar Kokoschka Prize from Austria and the Spectrum-International Award for Photography of the Foundation of Lower Saxony, Germany. Current projects include solo shows in New York and Europe, books, films, an upcoming project at the Deutsche Guggenheim Berlin, and retrospectives at Museum Moderner Kunst Stiftung Ludwig Vienna, Austria and the Kunsthhaus, Graz, Austria, and at the Musee d'art Contemporain de Nimes, France. He has been made an honorary Doctor of Fine Arts by Otis Art Institute of Parsons School of Design of the New School of Social Research, and by San Diego State University and the California State University.
