Guideline questions for (postgraduate) profiles (research students)

- 1. What is your research about (in layman's terms)?
- 2. What led you to this area of research—what sparked your interest?
- 3. What are your long-term career plans and ambitions?
- 4. Who is your supervisor, and how did you hear about them?
- 5. How did you hear about this research opportunity/come to choose this research programme?
- 6. What aspect of the research is most engaging? What is the most daunting?
- 7. How do you find the learning environment at NUI Galway?
- 8. Are you supported in attending conferences, training, fieldwork, etc., during the course of your research studies?
- 9. Do you have the opportunity of gaining teaching experience whilst completing your research, and, if so, can you describe how this is a rewarding experience for you.
- 10. How do you find the postgraduate social community at NUI Galway?
- 11. How do you find the postgraduate intellectual community at NUI Galway? *e.g., seminars, poster presentations, stimulating research culture, etc.*
- 12. Would you recommend NUI Galway to other prospective research students and why?
