### Information Sheet for Admission as an Occasional Student in the School of Nursing and Midwifery, National University of Ireland, Galway

**You are classed as an *Occasional* Student in the School of Nursing & Midwifery NUI Galway if:**

You have been admitted to undertake a programme of study that is a module of a recognised full-time programme. On completion, this module will give you 12 ECTS which may be credited towards further academic study. As an Occasional Student however, you are not on a programme leading to a Degree, Diploma or any other award of this University. #### **Admission**

Occasional students are considered for admission on the basis of their application, and considering the following points:

1. Their previous academic and current clinical practice
2. A personal statement outlining their current clinical role and their need for the stand alone module
3. Recommendation by the Programme Director concerned, in favour of the application

#### **Application**

Application must be made on an official application form of the Admissions Office, National University of Ireland, Galway. Attached please find an application form to apply as an Occasional Student in the School of Nursing and Midwifery, NUI Galway.

The following documents should accompany your application:

1. Copy of certificate of payment of current year Annual Retention Fee to An Bord Altranais.
2. Copy of original transcript of previous studies undertaken (if you have never been a student of NUI Galway)
3. Copy of birth certificate (if you have never been a student of NUI Galway)
4. A letter of support from your Director of Nursing/Assistant Director of Nursing.
5. A signed passport-sized photograph

#### **Closing Date for Applications**

The closing date for receipt of applications from Occasional students wishing to undertake a module in Semester 1 (September to December 2010) is **Friday 30 July 2010**. The closing date for receipt of applications from Occasional students wishing to undertake a module in Semester 2 (January – March 2011) is **Friday 29th October 2010**.

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### **Acceptance of Offer and Fee Payment**

The letter of offer to successful applicants will prescribe a date by which acceptance of the offer, in writing, must be notified. Applicants accepting an offer must forward, by the acceptance date, at least one-half of the module fee. The remainder of the fee is payable at registration.
