Workshop Absence Compensation- Student Presentation Date (Determined by Tutor Availability)

100% attendance at scheduled workshops is compulsory and a course requirement. It is the student's responsibility to inform the Programme Administrator of their absence either before or on the morning of the scheduled workshop.

If a student cannot attend a workshop as scheduled they will be required to make a presentation (in person or via on-line engagement) to the workshop tutor, after having first reviewed the module, the workshop slides, and the assignment content. The tutor will determine the focus of the presentation in advance. However, this can only happen on one occasion per term (i.e. once in Sem. 1 Sept.–Dec., and/or once in Sem. 2 Jan.–May). Students should be aware that missing a workshop(s) necessitating delivery of presentation(s) to tutors will impact on their existing coursework. This presentation is assessed on a pass/fail basis only (it will not accrue module credit) to facilitate the student to redeem the workshop absence and then, subject to passing the presentation, progress to the requisite module assessment. There is a €100.00 surcharge for the opportunity to partake in each presentation process, to be paid to Community Education in advance of the presentation in question. This fee will be waived upon submission of medical certification to the programme management team.

More than two workshop absences will require the student to repeat the year.

Please note: Changes may occur to the timetable during periods of extreme weather conditions. Such changes will only occur when deemed essential to student safety but may warrant both date and venue changes in order to facilitate programme provision.
