Táimid anseo inniu chun ceiliúradh poiblí a dhéanamh ar an ghaisce acadúil atá déanta agaibh i gceann bhur gcuid cúrsaí léinn le cúpla bliain anuas. Lá mór i bhféilire na hOllscoile atá ann agus ócáid níos mó agus níos tábhachtaí arís in bhur saol féin. Go maire sibh bhur gcéimíocht úr agus guím gach rath oraibh sa tsaol atá romhaibh amach mar chéimithe de chuid Ollscoil na hÉireann, Gaillimh.

The formal ceremony today, which involves a procession led by a mace bearer, musical accompaniment, the special robes, and the use of Latin, English and Irish, has a long tradition spanning many centuries. In Ireland it goes all the way back to the first university, established in Dublin in 1320, though it no longer exists, and has continued through the establishment and continuation of ten further universities. This University was originally one of three Queen's Colleges established in 1845 in Belfast, Cork and Galway.

Then as now this University and its staff have been about ensuring that those who pass through here as students go out into the wide world equipped with the best education that they can get and that we can give them. The word 'university' comes from the Latin

Celebrating over 50 years of Adult Learning since 1969, the Centre for Adult Learning and Professional Development has been working with communities, individuals and regional agencies to ensure professional and personal development opportunities are available to those who wish to upskill or to those who might otherwise face barriers to university education.

From the early beginnings of outreach, extra-mural courses to fully accredited flexible programmes which are on offer today in areas such as Business, Humanities, Early Childhood Studies, Training and Education, IT, Languages, Community Education and many others, the Centre for Adult Learning and Professional Development has accumulated a wealth of experience and knowledge in the development and delivery of foundation level studies through to masters awards.

Through its lifelong learning programmes and outreach strategies, the University is committed to the values of openness and accessibility supporting regional development and meeting the educational needs of individuals and communities across the region and country.

The University's flexible learning programmes allow students to study anytime, anywhere and anyhow. It's Strategic Plan has committed itself to the value of Open NUI Galway and increasing access and lifelong learning opportunities for all learners. During the academic year 2020–21 just ended, NUI Galway provided Access and part-time courses to over 2,000 students across the region. Many of these students had been absent from formal education for a considerable length of time, but all recognized the importance of up-skilling in order to remain competitive and equipped to meet the needs of the ever-changing workplace while others undertook their programme of study for self-development and personal interest reasons.

Our programmes

New programme developments have focused on making courses more accessible and manageable for students by offering staged awards at Certificate, Diploma, Degree, Masters and even at individual module level, to ensure that these educational opportunities reach as many people as possible from all representative groups. Conscious of the need for students to constantly upskill and apply their learning to the workplace, these new programmes have addressed emerging skills needs in industry in areas such as business management, leadership development, Information Technology and many others.

Over the past number of years, the Centre for Adult Learning and Professional Development in partnership with the University academic community, commenced a series of one-year blended learning Diplomas in Change Management, Technology Enhanced Learning and Learning and Development and a two-year Higher Diploma in Business Studies for non-

business graduates. It has also recently launched two new Diplomas in Scientific Studies specializing in Earth and Ocean Science and Apiculture (Beekeeping).

Over the course of the COVID 19 pandemic, our courses were offered in a fully online mode. Based on student demand, many have remained fully online in the current academic year, while others have returned to their former blended-learning and classroom-based mode of delivery. The flexibility offered by fully online and blended methods allows students to develop invaluable skills while maintaining their employment and personal commitments. Our courses offer a holistic, person-centred approach to a student's learning experience. While specific knowledge and vocational skills are taught, our programmes also offer students an opportunity to develop their professional skills such as communications, problem-solving, presentation skills as well as their technical skills. The link between theory and practice is constantly forged as course assessment and case studies are based on real-life scenarios and can be customized to the suit an individual student's workplace.

With an expansive range of courses on offer including Science and Technology,

Business and Management, Early Childhood Studies, Information Technology, Training and Education, Community Education and others, there has never been a better time for prospective students to upskill or refocus their career by choosing a part-time study route.

The staff of the Centre for Adult Learning and Professional Development congratulate all of today's graduands and wishes them success in their future careers.

An Ionad Foghlama agus Forbartha Gairmiúla d'Aosaigh

Oideachas a Spreagann

Tá an tIonad Foghlama agus Forbartha Gairmiúla d'Aosaigh ag comóradh os cionn 50 bliain d'Fhoghlaim Aosach ó 1969 i leith agus tá an tIonad ag obair le pobail, daoine aonair agus gníomhaireachtaí réigiúnacha chun a chinntiú go bhfuil deiseanna forbartha gairmiúla agus pearsanta ar fáil dóibh siúd ar mian leo breisoiliúint a chur orthu féin nó dóibh siúd a d'fhéadfadh go mbeadh bacainní chuig oideachas ollscoile orthu murach na deiseanna seo.

Cúrsaí for-rochtana a bhíodh ann ar dtús, ansin cúrsaí seachtracha agus anois tá cláir sholúbtha atá creidiúnaithe go hiomlán i réimsí lena n-áirítear Gnó, na Daonnachtaí, Staidéar LuathÓige, Oiliúint agus Oideachas, IT, Teangacha, Oideachas Pobail agus go leor leor eile. Tá taithí na mblianta ag an Ionad Foghlama agus Forbartha Gairmiúla d'Aosaigh ar chlár ag an mbonnleibhéal suas go dtí gradaim mháistreachta a fhorbairt agus a chur ar fáil.

Trína cláir foghlama fadsaoil agus straitéisí for-rochtana, tá an Ollscoil tiomanta do luachanna na hoscailteachta agus na hinrochtaineachta, ag tacú le forbairt réigiúnach agus ag freastal ar riachtanais oideachais daoine aonair agus an phobail ar fud an réigiúin agus na tíre.

Tugann cláir foghlama solúbtha na hOllscoile deis do mhic léinn staidéar a dhéanamh ag am ar bith, in áit ar bith agus ar bhealach ar bith. I bPlean Straitéiseach na hOllscoile, tugtar gealltanas go luach OÉ Gaillimh Oscailte agus deiseanna foghlama agus iontrálacha a mhéadú do gach foghlaimeoir. Sa bhliain acadúil 2020-21, chuir OÉ Gaillimh cúrsaí Rochtana agus cúrsaí páirtaimseartha ar fáil do níos mó ná 2,000 mac léinn ar fud an réigiúin. Bhí go leor de na mic léinn seo as láthair ó oideachas foirmiúil cuid mhaith, ach thuig siad ar fad an tábhacht a bhaineann le breisoiliúint le bheith iomaíoch agus a bheith in ann freastal ar riachtanais an ionaid oibre atá de shíor ag athrú. Thug cuid mhaith eile faoi chlár staidéir ar mhaithe le féinforbairt agus mar gheall go raibh suim phearsanta acu ann.

Sa bhliain acadúil 2020-21, chuir OÉ Gaillimh cúrsaí Rochtana agus cúrsaí páirtaimseartha ar fáil do níos mó ná 2,000 mac léinn ar fud an réigiúin. Bhí go leor de na mic léinn seo as láthair ó oideachas foirmiúil cuid mhaith, ach thuig siad ar fad an tábhacht a bhaineann le breisoiliúint le bheith iomaíoch agus a bheith in ann freastal ar riachtanais an ionaid oibre atá de shíor ag athrú. Thug cuid mhaith eile faoi chlár staidéir ar mhaithe le féinforbairt agus mar gheall go raibh suim phearsanta acu ann.

Ár gcuid clár

Sna forbairtí nua a rinneadh ar chlár díriodh ar chúrsaí níos inrochtana agus níos soláimhsithe a chur ar fáil do mhic léinn trí dhámhachtainí céimnithe a thairiscint ag leibhéal Teastais, Diplóma, Céime, Máistreachta agus fiú ar bhonn modúil aonair, chun a chinntiú go mbeidh deis ag an oiread daoine agus is féidir ó gach grúpa ionadaíoch ar na deiseanna oideachais seo. Tuigimid an riachtanas leanúnach atá ag mic léinn cur lena gcuid foghlama agus é a chur i bhfeidhm san ionad oibre, leis na cláir nua seo tugtar aghaidh ar riachtanais scileanna atá ag teacht chun cinn sa tionscal i réimsí lena n-áirítear gnó, forbairt ceannaireachta, Teicneolaíocht Faisnéise agus go leor eile.

Le cúpla bliain anuas, chuir an tIonad Foghlama agus Forbartha Gairmiúla d'Aosaigh, in éineacht le pobal acadúil na ollscoile, tús le sraith Dioplómaí ar feadh bliain amháin san fhoghlaim chumaisc i mBainistíocht Athruithe, Foghlaim Feabhsaithe Teicneolaíochta agus Foghlaim agus Forbairt, chomh maith le Ard-Dioplóma sa Staidéar Gnó do chéimithe nach ndearna staidéar ar an ngnó roimhe seo. Chuir an tIonad dhá Ard-Dioplóma nua i Staidéar Eolaíochta le speisialtóireacht sna hEolaíochtaí Domhain agus Aigéin agus Beachtaireacht ar fáil freisin.

Le linn na paindéime Covid-19, cuirtear ár gcúrsaí ar fáil trí modhanna ar líne amháin. De réir eileamh na daltaí, tá an chúid is mó de na cúrsaí fós le fáil ar líne an bhliain acadúil seo, agus tá cúpla ceann éile le fáil trí modhanna ranga agus ar líne. Tugann modhanna ar líne agus cumaisc solúbthacht do mhic léinn scileanna fíorúsáideacha a fhoghlaim agus fanacht i bpoist agus aird a thabhairt ar chúraimí pearsanta. Tá cur chuige iomlánaíoch, dírithe ar an duine ag ár gcúrsaí a chuireann le taithí foghlama na mac léinn. Roinntear saineolas agus scileanna gairmiúla leis na mic léinn ar na cláir agus tugtar an deis dóibh a scileanna proifisiúnta a fhorbairt cosúil lena scileanna cumarsáide, réitigh fadhbanna, scileanna cur I láthair agus a gcuid scileanna teicniúla. Déantar an nasc idir teoiric agus cleachtadh a chruthú i gcónaí mar go mbíonn measúnuithe agus cás-staidéir bunaithe ar chásanna réalacha agus is féidir iad a chur in oiriúint do láthair oibre an mhic léinn aonair.

Tá raon leathan clár ar fáil lena n-áirítear Eolaíocht agus Teicneolaíocht, Gnó agus Bainistíocht, Staidéar Luath-Óige, Teicneolaíocht Faisnéise, Oiliúint agus Oideachas, Oideachas Pobail agus go leor eile, mar sin, anois an t-am do mhic léinn breisoiiliúint a chur orthu féin nó gairm bheatha nua a lorg dóibh féin trí staidéar go páirtaimseartha a roghnú.

Déanann foireann an Ionaid Foghlama agus Forbartha Gairmiúla d'Aosaigh comhghairdeas leis na réamhchéimithe ar fad anseo inniu agus guímid gach rath orthu ina ngairm amach anseo.

Professor Hubert McDermott

Professor Hubert McDermott was awarded BA and MA degrees in English by University College Galway and a DPhil degree by the University of Ulster. He was appointed to a lectureship in English in 1965 and delivered his last lecture in 2015.

Professor McDermott was a member of the university's Governing Authority for 45 years. He also served as a member of The Conference of Irish Universities, The Senate of the National University of Ireland, The National Council for Educational Awards and The Irish Council for Overseas Students. Hubert was one of the founders of *Cumann Céimithe na Gaillimhe* and remains a trustee.



For many years, Professor McDermott was head of the department of English, chair of the Board of Extra Mural Studies and of the Board of Applied Communications. He was also, until his retirement, the director of the MA in Journalism.

In addition to his work in English, Professor McDermott has delivered programmes in communications in every college in the university – Arts, Medicine, Science/ Engineering and Business/Law, at both undergraduate and postgraduate level. For instance, he taught a two-semester programme in communication skills to industrial engineering undergraduates for over fifteen years. Similarly, he taught a one-semester module in presentation skills to postgraduate marketing students, from the initiation of the Diploma in Marketing Practice, in the 1980s, until his retirement.

Professor McDermott played a pivotal role in staff development programmes in the university over many years. He was also a senior trainer and academic director of programmes for the Irish Universities Training Network, where he specialised in effective third-level teacher training and presentation skills. He was also a staff-development trainer for The Association of Irish University Librarians. Hubert has been a lecturer on the Open Learning modules of the university's Adult Learning and Professional Development Department since their commencement.

Professor McDermott has been centrally involved in and deeply committed to the development of the university's Adult and Continuing Education programmes during all his years on staff. As chair of the university's Board of Extra Mural Studies, over many years, he helped to shepherd in a new Evening BA degree programme for part-time students. He taught continuously on this programme from its inception until his retirement. Additionally, he taught stand-alone modules in communications for adults. These took place in over 30 towns all over Ireland for more than forty years. Locations ranged from Bunclara and Carndonagh in the north, to Tullamore and Dublin in the east, to Charleville and Cork in the south.

Novel and Romance: the Odyssey to Tom Jones, a major monograph by Professor McDermott, is widely regarded as ushering in a new and revolutionary approach to an understanding of the history and development of English fiction. Hubert has wide experience as extern examiner in both English and communications for many Irish and UK universities.
