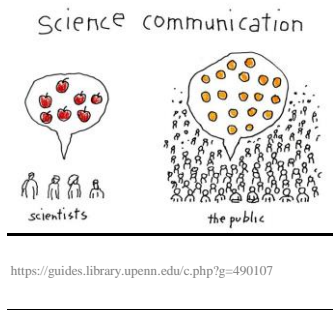




Natural and Human Heritages Spring Lunchtime Lecture Series
