- NUI Galway was awarded Ireland's first UNESCO Chair
 – in Children, Youth and Civic Engagement.
- The Insight Centre for Data Analytics positions Ireland at the heart of global data analytics research.
- Ireland's only facility for manufacturing adult stem cells for human trials is at NUI Galway.

- The Ryan Institute is Ireland's largest Environmental, Marine and Energy Research group.
- Researchers in our Irish Centre for Human Rights are recognised among the world's leading experts in human rights law.
- Our Centre for Health Promotion Research, the only

one of its kind in Ireland, has World Health Organisation (WHO) status for its role in health promotion education and research.

- The digitised Abbey Theatre Archive, the world's largest digital theatre archive, is in development.
- Galway is one of five global hubs in a medtech market, worth €95 billion annually in the EU.
- CÚRAM, the Centre for Research in Medical Devices, is a major new national research centre based at NUI Galway.

Research

Teaching and Learning

- NUI Galway offers almost 60 undergraduate degrees, 585 postgraduate programmes and a wide range of parttime diplomas and degrees.
- 195 students completed PhDs and graduated with doctorates from NUI Galway in 2013-14.
- Over 15% of our undergraduate student body are non-traditional students, including mature students,

socio-economically disadvantaged students, students with a disability, members of the travelling community and ethnic minorities.

 The James Hardiman Library houses over 450,000 printed books, 350,000 e-books and more than 30,000 full text electronic journals across a wide range of subjects, as well as an impressive literary and theatrical archive.



The Student Experience

A distinguished University, NUI Galway offers a distinctive student experience.

- The University offers scholarships to first year students including;
 Excellence Scholarships; Creative Arts Performance Points; Sports
 Performance Points; and Elite Sports
 Scholarships.
- NUI Galway's student completion rate is higher than any other university in Ireland, at 86%.
- NUI Galway is one of Ireland's top universities for graduate employability with 93% of our graduates employed or in further study within six months of graduating.
- The University is leading the way in student volunteering and civic engagement.
- More than 70% of our undergraduate degrees now enable students to put their learning into practice in a community setting.

Developing our Campus **€400m**

NUI Galway is in the final stages of a €400 million capital investment programme, the single largest capital development plan ever undertaken by the University. This investment has transformed the 105 hectare riverside campus. Students and staff now have access to the very best facilities for teaching and research.

- NUI Galway is ranked in the top 2% of universities in the world for the quality of its research and teaching.
- NUI Galway was the only Irish university to increase its position in both the *QS World University Rankings* and *Times Higher Education Rankings* in 2014.
- NUI Galway has also been awarded the top rating of five stars in the *QS Stars* rating system.
- The University received the five star rating for the quality of its teaching and research, for its facilities, for engagement, internationalisation and innovation.

The Arts at NUI Galway

NUI Galway has an excellent reputation for supporting and developing the arts. The University is home to a unique campus-based active arts environment.



• NUI Galway has its own art collection of almost 500 pieces representing Irish painting and sculpture.

- Múscailt, the Spring Arts Festival, includes new and original music and theatre performances.
- The Bank of Ireland Theatre hosts student drama productions, as well as a range of productions by touring theatre and dance companies.
- NUI Galway has an extensive literary and theatre archive collection including the archive of playwright, Thomas Kilroy, the archive of director, writer and actor, John Huston, the Druid Theatre Company archive, the Abbey Theatre Archive and more.
- The University has a number of strategic partnerships with Arts organisations including the Abbey Theatre, Ireland's National Theatre, Druid Theatre Company, An Taibhdhearc, the Irish language National Theatre, and the Galway Arts Festival.

Sport

With 54 clubs, experienced coaches and the latest facilities, sport is central to life on campus.

- NUI Galway's elite sports
 programme for talented athletes
 including coaching from our elite
 sports officer, access to our elite
 sports gym, and a package of
 sports supports.
- In 2014, NUI Galway announced it will reward a limited number of athletes, applying for undergraduate courses, with 40 CAO Performance Points.
- A generous sports scholarships programme to help students with outstanding potential to achieve their goals, both in their sporting and academic careers.





NUI Galway boasts outstanding sporting and recreational facilities. Our 6,500 sq metre Sports Centre includes facilities of an international standard such as:

- 6-lane, 25 metre swimming pool with moveable floor, dedicated squash and racquetball courts. National league basketball arena and sports hall 100 piece cardiovascular gym
- Dedicated elite training gym
- Fitness studios for aerobic training
- A competition style climbing wall
- Saunas and steam room

Outdoor sporting facilities include:

- An 8-lane synthetic international standard track
- Grass pitches for Gaelic games, soccer and rugby
- Astroturf pitches in development
- Excellent water conditions for rowing, kayaking and canoeing with plans in development for upgrade to water sports facilities

Commercialising our research

NUI Galway continued to excel in delivering commerical outcomes for research activities in 2013/14.

Technologies developed, and taken up by industry, span areas such as animal health, biopharma, medical devices, tissue engineering, biorefining and bio-energy and ICT.

- 5 new NUI Galway start-up companies were formed.
- 11 technologies were licensed to new or existing companies.
- 67 new invention disclosures were filed.
- 40 new collaborative R&D projects with industry partners.


