It is therefore important that you indicate clearly in your order of preference the programmes that you are willing to accept. Every effort will be made to accommodate your order of preference and indicating lower preferences will not in any way affect the consideration of your higher preferences.

Guidelines for the admission of students holding QQI (HETAC) Diplomas/B. Eng (Level 7)

Third Year Entry: The minimum attainment required of holders of the B.Eng (level 7) Degrees / QQI (HETAC) Diplomas seeking admission to Third Year of the Degree Courses in the College of Engineering & Informatics is 60% overall average in an appropriate Level 7 Degree / QQI (HETAC) National Diploma and 70% in Maths in the award year.

Second Year Entry: The minimum attainment required of holders of the B.Eng (level 7) Degree /QQI (HETAC) Diplomas seeking admission to the Second Year of Degree Courses in the College of Engineering & Informatics is 50% overall average (**Merit 2**) in an appropriate Level 7 Degree / QQI (HETAC) National Diploma.

Candidates are advised that the attainment of any of the qualifications outlined in the above guidelines does not oblige the College of Engineering and Informatics to accept their application for entry into any of the degree programmes listed above. In some cases candidates holding a 60% average in a level 7 Degree / QQI (HETAC) Diploma may be offered a place in the Second rather than the Third Year of a Degree Course.

Guidelines for the admission of students wishing to transfer to NUI Galway following successful completion of 1^{st} year at level 8 at another University

Every application is considered on its individual merits. Consideration will normally be given only to candidates who have passed previous examinations taken at their current University and who have attained the CAO points required for the course selected. Candidates must also satisfy matriculation requirements.

The number of transfer places available in any one year is limited.

<u>Guidelines for the admission of students wishing to transfer to NUI Galway following successful</u> completion of 1st vear at level 8 at another University

Every application is considered on its individual merits. Consideration will normally be given only to candidates who have passed previous examinations taken at their current University and who have attained the CAO points required for the course selected. Candidates must also satisfy matriculation requirements.

Application: Application must be made online. You will also be required to upload supporting

documents such as: certified copy of transcripts and a photocopy of Birth

Certificate (Baptismal Certificate not acceptable).

It is the applicant's responsibility to upload certified copies of a detailed transcript, including the overall result in percentage terms, marks for all subjects

taken and examinations presented at the Institute of Technology.

Repeat results of autumn examinations will not normally be considered.

The **closing date** for submission of online applications for entry to **Second/Third Year** Courses is 15th July 2018.
