NUI Galway – StudentSurvey.ie 2022 results

NUI Galway undertakes the StudentSurvey.ie annually and consistently performs well against other Irish universities in both our participation rates and student satisfaction rates as evidenced by the results of 2 key satisfaction questions below:

The StudentSurvey.ie is designed to focus on student engagement, namely the amount of time and effort that students put into meaningful and purposeful educational activities and the extent to which institutions provide such opportunities and encourage students to engage with them. Research shows that students who engage more frequently in educationally purposeful activities both in and outside the classroom get better grades, are more satisfied, and are more likely to persist and graduate. NUI Galway is committed to interpreting and utilising StudentSurvey.ie data to enhance the experiences of our students.

2978 of NUI Galway students responded to StudentSurvey.ie (formerly known as ISSE) survey in 2022. This number yields a response rate of 26%.

Of these 1415 were First Year students (Y1), 739 were Final Year students (YF) and 739 were Postgraduate Taught students (PGT) (response rate 31.5%, 23.5%, 22.9% respectively). The summary demographics of respondents profile is reported in Table 1.

Table 1 demonstrates the overall satisfaction amongst NUI Galway students. In 2022 73.9 % of NUIG students rated their overall educational experience at NUIG as Excellent/Good (65.7 % in 2021, 79.9 % Other Unis in 2022). 80.2 % of NUIG students stated they would come to NUI

Galway if they had to start over again (81.4 % in 2021, 85.1 % Other Unis 2022) rating their educational experience at NUI Galway as good or excellent.

In terms of the data, the percentage results for all questions are detailed in Table 3.

To aid navigation, these questions are grouped under certain engagement indicators and the responses for individual questions are combined to create nine related indicator scores. These indicator scores act as 'signposts' and are calculated on a scale from 0 to 60 - with the lowest response placed at 0, and the highest placed at 60 - and weighted based on cohort and gender.

10 Indicator Scores [out of max 60]

The following table (Table 2) provides the weighted calculated score (out of 60) for each of the 10 engagement indicators for both National University of Ireland, Galway (NUIG) and the average calculated score for the remaining 6 other Irish Universities. The detailed percentage responses per question are detailed in Table 3.

Note: The colour coding highlights comparison with Other Unis averages and an index is UNDERLINED if it increased from the previous year. In 2022 9 out of 10 indices increased from 2021 year. In 2022 year, 0 out of 10 indices are above the Other Unis averages. In 2021 year, 1 out of 10 indices were above. Please, note, that a new index - LC - 'Learning, Creative and Social Skills' was introduced in 2022, which groups previously non-indicator variables and one new variable together. Please see APPENDIX 2 for further details.




Figure 1. NUI Galway Indices, 2019-2022.

Figure 1 depicts the four year level of indices and helps to see the effect of COVID (year 2021 as in 2020 StudentSurvey was conducted BEFORE the lockdown) and recovery in 2022.
