Programme Description

Healthcare organisations require informed, effective leadership when delivering high quality services. Students of this programme will acquire the knowledge necessary to assume senior healthcare positions nationally and internationally.

Module Titles

The MHSc comprises of 7 modules, focused on nursing practice, delivered over two years:

- Managing Finance in Healthcare Organisations (10 ECTs).
- Quality and Healthcare Management (10 ECTs).
- Principles of Healthcare Leadership (10 ECTs).
- Strategic Management and Leadership (10 ECTs).
- Healthcare Project Management (10 ECTs).
- Healthcare Ethics (10 ECTs).
- Enhancing Evidence Based Practice (30 ECTs).

Duration: Two years (part-time).
The MHSc runs annually in
September (subject to numbers).

Fees: €3,600 per annum

Who Should Apply:

Healthcare professionals - Nurses, Midwives, Mental Health Practitioners, Health Promotion Practitioners, Practice Nurses, Dieticians, Physiotherapists, Occupational Therapists.

Entry Requirements

- A primary degree (min 2:2) in Nursing or Healthcare related field
- Minimum of three years post-registration nursing /health related experience
- Evidence of professional registration where applicable

Research/Employment Opportunities:

The completion of the MHSc (International Healthcare Management) will provide the students with a Masters qualification that will support graduates to assume senior healthcare management roles in the Republic of Ireland and internationally.
